On average, MFC serves over 2400 unique individuals (counted one time during the year) through all of its programs and services. COVID-19 Pandemic Relief, Williams Fork and East Troublesome Fires have pushed MFC's numbers to new heights. Estimating nearly 3,500 unique individuals served. Housing, utility assistance and hunger relief operated at 200-250% above capacity between March and June.
