Vaccine Distribution Underway

"Vaccination against Covid-19 has begun in Grand County. Many have already received their first dose, and some have completed both doses. The County continues to vaccinate as quickly and efficiently as possible, factoring in guidance from the state, and availability of doses. If you are over age 70, you may already be eligible to receive the vaccine, should you choose to do so.

From Grand County Public Health:

Grand County is in the final stages of Phase 1A and begins looking toward the early stages of administering populations in Phase 1B (above the dotted line).

GCPH will not be able to move below the "dotted line" of the phase 1B population until given specific direction from Governor Polis and the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment. Providing vaccine to non-authorized populations at this time will result in the penalty of being denied further vaccine delivery to vaccinate the Grand County community.

In order to ensure that GCPH has committed individuals for each Phase of the distribution process, we have developed a Vaccine Registration Form for individuals who are not already being provided access to the vaccine through their employers and a Vaccine Registration Form for businesses."

If you are interested in receiving the vaccine as soon as you are eligible, please visit **https://www.co.grand.co.us/vaccine** or call the Joint Information Hotline at 970-725-3803 to register.

This registration form will not schedule you for an appointment to get the vaccine. This form will put your name on the list of interested persons in Grand County wanting to get the vaccine. Once this form is submitted, Grand County Public Health or a partnering local medical clinic will contact you when they have a vaccine ready for you. Depending on the phase of vaccine administration in which you qualify, you may be contacted relatively soon or it may take quite some time.



We do require at least 48 hours advance notice for in-county trips and 72 hours or more advance notice for out-ofcounty trips (Denver, Summit County). Donations to help cover costs are appreciated, but we will never deny a ride, regardless of ability to contribute. Suggested contribution amounts are \$3-\$7 for in-county trips and \$25-\$40 for out-of-county trips.

Spotting Bald Eagles

January and February are the best time in Colorado to spot Bald Eagles! Our national symbol was once endangered by the pesticide DDT — there were only about 10 nesting pairs in Colorado in the 1970s, according to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. After spending some time on the Endangered Species List, their population has rebounded. As many as 1,200 birds will visit our state this winter. There are currently an estimated 125 nesting pairs, according to Colorado Parks and Wildlife.



Bald Eagles can be found throughout Grand County, if you know where to look. Use these tips from the Denver Post and you're sure to spot our National Bird this winter!

- Bald eagles rarely stray from a good source of water, so river corridors and large reservoirs are good places to spot them.
- As with most wildlife, sunrise and just before sunset are the best times to spot bald eagles.
- Do not approach the eagles. If the eagles change their behavior, that means you're too close. If you can see them from your vehicle, stay in it. You will want a good spotting scope or strong pair of binoculars.
- Eagles prefer to stay perched instead of fly when it's really cold, so you may want to go searching on a really cold day.


Senior Book Club

February Recipe: Spinach Beef Biscuit Bake

Servings: 6

Prep Time: 15 minutes

Cook Time: 25-30 minutes

Ingredients:

- 1 large tube buttermilk biscuits
- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 2-3 cloves chopped garlic
- 1 10 ounce pkg frozen chopped spinach, thawed and squeezed dry
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1/2 cup shredded cheese (mozzarella, cheddar, jack, etc.)

Directions:

Press and flatten biscuits on the bottom and up the sides of a greased 8x8 pan. Set aside. In a skillet, cook beef, onion and garlic until meat is no longer pink. Add spinach, cream of mushroom soup and cheese. Mix well.

Spoon into prepared crust and bake uncovered at 375 degrees for 30 minutes or until crush is lightly browned.
