On average, MFC serves 3400 unique individuals (counted one time during the year) through all of its programs and services. COVID-19 Pandemic Relief, Williams Fork and East Troublesome Fires have pushed numbers to new heights- estimating over 6,400 unique individuals were served in 2020.
