On average, MFC serves 3400 unique individuals (counted one time during the year) through all of its programs and services. In 2020-21, COVID-19 Pandemic Relief, Williams Fork and East Troublesome Fires pushed numbers to new heights- estimating over 6,400 unique individuals accessing housing, utilities, clothing and grocery support.

The Mobile Food Pantry is reaching 200 additional people each month.
